

SITE

The site is the first floor of a three storey dwelling that occupies a 4000 sqft parcel of land where the erstwhile family villa stood. The villa was demolished and replaced by a single building.

The site faces North, and is open on all four sides.


The designer inherited the building structure and envelope from the client, as depicted on the right.



FIRST FLOOR PLAN


DESIGN BRIEF



FIRST ITERATIONS


The couple enjoyed cooking together and preferred less reliance on staff for house maintenance.







SECOND ITERATION

The circulation from the foyer to the rear of the house was resolved by swapping the rectangular store for a round volume.







PROPOSED LAYOUT



I was involved from the outset of the project and was able to influence certain structural decisions, and also involve the structure in the space.



The structure inherited from the architect was rather bulky- with deep beams and large sunken slabs. These had to be harmonized to create well-proportioned volumes with minimum false ceilings and fine detailing.





Grooves in the plaster and coves in the false ceiling are introduced to make the beams feel more graceful, and integrate them in the spatial composition.








OPEN PLAN

The design sought to create line of sight across the length of the house- from the TV room, through the kitchen to the living room and from the kitchen to the foyer.

The round store allows the space to flow, while still providing necessary separation between functions, in the open plan.
